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#### DAY 1

#### 细节理解题解题指导(I)

#### 一、解题技巧

细节理解题是考查最多的一种题型,常用 who、when、where、what、which、why、 how many 和 how much 等提问,一般只涉及文章的局部内容。常见的细节理解题有五种考 查形式: 直接细节题、语义转化题、综合细节题、排列顺序题、数字计算题。本部分重点 讲解前三种题型,后两种题型会在 Day 2 部分进行讲解。

#### 1. 直接细节题

有些细节理解题直接针对文章中出现的时间、地点、人物、事件、原因、结果等信息 设题,因此答案就在文章中。对于这类题目,应先读题干和选项确定关键词,带着关键词 快速浏览全文,采用寻读法定位关键信息,找到正确答案。寻读是指为了查找某一项具体 事实或某一项特定信息(如人物、事件、时间、地点、数字等)而对其他无关内容略去不 读的快速阅读方法。

#### 真题示例 1

Waste can bring a lot of problems. Although China is rich in some resources, we are short of others, for example, fresh water. It is reported that we will have no coal or oil to use in 100 years. So if we go on wasting our resources, what can we use in the future, and where can we move? Think about it. I think we should say no to the students who waste things every day. Everybody should stop wasting as soon as possible.

【解析】题干中的关键词为 100 years, 带着关键词阅读文章, 定位关键信息 "It is reported that we will have no coal or oil to use in 100 years."。由此可知, 100年 后我们也许没有煤炭或石油可用。故选D。

- 【解析】题干中的关键词为 Follow Your Heart,带着关键词阅读文章,定位关键信息"Do you ever try to make your dream come true? Follow Your Heart is written by Andrew Matthews, an Australian writer. The book tells ..."。由此可知, Follow Your Heart 是 澳大利亚作家 Andrew Matthews 写的一本书。故选 C。

#### 2. 语义转化题

在语义转化题中,有时候题干或选项会对文章中的语句进行一定的改变,如进行近义 词替换、把肯定句变为否定句、做进一步解释说明等。对于这类题目,先定位与题目有关 的语句,然后细读内容,将题干或选项与定位句进行对比,判断信息是否一致。

#### 真题示例 1

It was Mother's Day, but the young mother was a little unhappy, because she was 800 miles away from her parents. In the morning she phoned her mother to wish her a happy Mother's Day, and her mother told her about the beautiful lilacs (丁香) in the garden.

- 【解析】题干中的关键词为 a little unhappy on Mother's Day,带着关键词阅读文章,定位关键信息"It was Mother's Day, but the young mother was a little unhappy, because she was 800 miles away from her parents."。对比选项和原文,800 miles是一段很远的距离,与 a long way 表达的意思一致。故选 B。

#### 真题示例 2

Reading bedtime stories can develop your children's ability to form pictures or ideas in their mind. A healthy imagination makes their minds work well and teaches them to think quickly yet effectively.

Reading also improves your children's language. They'll most likely use those words in the stories you read right after they hear them. Listening to many stories helps kids to express opinions better.

Reading books makes people more learned. When children hear the stories you tell, they learn grammar and vocabulary, for example. It helps them be successful in school as they already know a lot from your stories ...

more learned 意为 "更有学识的", 语义和 smarter 相近, C 选项也是好处之一。只有 D 选项文章没有提及。故选 D。

#### 3. 综合细节题

在综合细节题中,有时候关键信息会出现在不同的句子中,这些句子通常不会离得太远,这时需要对不同的语句进行归纳总结,理解关键信息所在语境的主旨大意。

#### 真题示例 1

As I got a little older I began to understand what my dad really meant. So, I read some books on fish. And I even joined the local fishing club and started attending the monthly meetings. I learned that a fish is a cold-blooded animal and therefore is very sensitive to water temperature. That is why fish prefer shallow water to deep water, because the former is warmer. Besides, water is usually warmer in direct sunlight than in the shade. Yet, fish don't have any eyelids and the sun hurts their eyes. The more I understood fish, the more I became effective at finding and catching them.

- 【解析】根据选项中的关键词 deep、shallow 和 sunlight 可以定位到关键信息 "That is why fish prefer shallow water ... and the sun hurts their eyes."。这几句话指出,鱼喜欢待在温度高的浅水中,阳光直射会让水温升高,但也会伤害鱼的眼睛。综合这些信息可知,鱼喜欢待在水浅且光照弱的地方。D选项(树下的浅水区)符合这一特征。故选 D。

They are working with governments in different countries to try to change the rules that govern (管控) what can and cannot be put into the sea. Let's hope something is done to stop the pollution of our seas before it's too late.

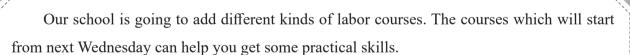

Many people around the world check how many steps they walk every day. This is because studies suggest that 10,000 steps a day is enough to help us stay healthy and live longer. However, a new study says just 4,000 steps a day could be the magic number for us to

live well into old age. Researchers from the Johns Hopkins University of Medicine analyzed 17 studies that looked at how far people walked during the week. The scientists found that 4,000 steps a day reduced the risk of dying from diabetes (糖尿病), heart diseases and other life-threatening conditions. The leading researcher Dr. Martin said 4,000 steps was about a 30- to 45-minute walk, or about three to four kilometers.

The study is published in the *European Journal of Preventive Cardiolgy*. The research examined health and exercise data from more than 225,000 adult participants worldwide over seven years. They had an average age of 64. Some of them were in good health, while others suffered from heart problems. Dr. Martin found that 4,000 steps was helpful, and that it was a minimum (最小的) amount. He said, "I wouldn't want people to look at that as a magic number. More is better." He added that walking an additional 1,000 steps a day was linked with a 15 percent lower risk of earlier death. He said people should add at least one walk to their daily routine.

#### 细节理解题解题指导(II)

#### 一、解题技巧

#### 1. 排列顺序题

记叙文和说明文可能会考查事件发生的顺序或活动的进行步骤,有时结合生活常识就能确定先后顺序;但当涉及的内容较多或较复杂时,则须把握题干中的关键词,根据关键词在文章中出现的顺序来确定答案,也可先确定第一条和最后一条,从而缩小选项范围。

#### 真题示例

They ran in and out of the water. They were having a great time. Suddenly, a big wave came. Tim fell down and was carried away off the shore. He was in danger. Bill was frightened. He looked around and spotted a lifeguard nearby. He quickly ran to him, waving his hands and shouting for help. The lifeguard rushed to the water, swam to Tim and brought him safely back to shore. Just then, Bill's and Tim's parents hurried to the scene. Tim's parents were fearful and thankful. They realized that without Bill's quick action, Tim might have been drowned ( 淹死 ).

有关年龄、价格、距离等的问题通常涉及数字计算,对于这类题目,可直接将题干或 选项中的数字当作关键词,回文定位,将找到的数据进行运算。
